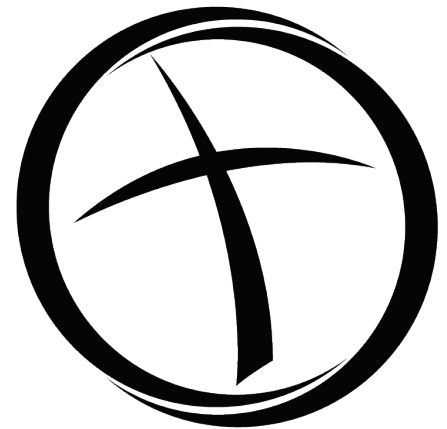
### **WE'RE GLAD YOU'RE HERE!**

Additionally, worship services are broadcast on a weekly basis. By participating, authorization to publish any such photo or video is granted to First Lutheran Church.

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
