

FORMER FIRST LUTHERAN EDIFICE PLANS 100-YEAR BUILDING ANNIVERSARY

The former home of First Lutheran Church, located on the corner of north Jackson and Ravine streets, at 336 N. Jackson St. Is celebrating the 100th anniversary of the building, and the laying of the cornerstone on September 28, 2024, at 2pm. The building was conceived in November of 1923, at the annual congregation meeting.

The church building was built by church members and labor hired on a day-by-day basis, due to cost. The church was dedicated in March of 1925. A Votteler-Holtkamp pipe organ was installed in 1928 at a \$5,000 cost. The building housed the Norwegian Lutheran Church, renamed to First Evangelical



Lutheran Church of Janesville to reflect its diverse membership in 1925. The membership grew from 420 members in 1925, to over 2,000 in 1955. The final service was held in September of 1955, at which time the new church at 612 North Randall was ready for dedication. The Jackson Street church became the Christian and Missionary Alliance (CMA) in 1956. And in 1979 our young church, Midwest Christian Center bought the building. Saving it



from being bought for use as a tavern. The church building thus still serves its original purpose. We are a non-denominational church where the Bible is the final authority, and all are welcome.

It's my desire to invite anyone who wishes to attend our ceremony. I especially feel that First Lutheran should be shown special consideration, without you, the building wouldn't exist! So, join us on Sept 28 at 2pm for a remembrance of the building's legacy, and the people behind it. We will be reading from the same passages in Scripture that Reverend T.C. Thorsen did 100 years ago. We will also enjoy a song or two played over the amazing organ that still functions today. I will



also display a board showing church construction and history, along with a home-made scale model of First Lutheran from 1940.

I will also be accepting orders for my book I've written about the church- 340 N. Jackson Street, A century of Faith

and Family 1924-2024. The book is 38 pages with 9 fullcolor picture pages. The book features extensive First Lutheran history as well. It is available for a donation



of \$32, with a portion being donated to the church leadership for building maintenance and upkeep. Lord willing, we will see everyone there! You can call 608.312.9795 with questions. 

Financial Report (Tim Drinkwater)

- Looking just at April of 2024: Giving was above budget for April for regular contributions. Total income for just April was \$8,823.045 above budget. Administration was over budget due to thew costs for the vision retreat. Worship was over budget due to the timing of Palm and Easter Sunday invoices. Overall, January through April 2024 ended with a net gain of \$5,585.
- On the 16-month P&L report we are above budget by \$85,754 for the Jan 1, 2023, to April 30, 2024, total contributions. Total income was \$1,79,583, above budget by \$105,695.


