# ANOTHER GREAT YEAR FOR THE FOUNDATION

As we look at the First Lutheran Church Foundation in 2025, I often wonder what the group of church members that formed the Foundation in 1967 would think about how we are doing. My fatherin-law, Robert Consigny, was there from the beginning, did the legal work to get it started and led the board for decades. Bob passed away 10 years ago, but I



can say with a lot of certainty that he would have a smile on his face and pronounce that the Lord has blessed First Lutheran Church.

Here are the historical reasons why I can say that:

1. The congregation has maintained commitment to the Foundation with 58 years of donations. The total giving at the end of 2024 was \$1,446,629. This is what we call the principal of the fund. Every dollar given gets added to this and is held sacred for the life of the Foundation. The account balance can never go below it and if it does, we cannot make any further distributions. (Held in "perpetuity" is the common phrase I use, but I recently had a church member tell me they have no idea what that means. So, I am describing it here in a different way).

- 2. Over the life of the Foundation, \$1,470,625 investment earnings have been distributed. These are donations given to community organizations on behalf of First Lutheran Church and dollars given back to the church (building and programs) that are outside of the normal operating budget.
- 3. The money has been invested wisely and the account balance of contributions and earnings at the end of 2024 was \$2,224,411.

donations/distribution of \$110,000 in 2025. That is a record amount!

- 2. The Foundation Board and the Church Council are working closer together than ever before. The Council helped in the prioritization of \$60,250 of distributions that is going back into our church building and programs. The last ten years has seen 71% of the distributions go to the church.
- 3. The remaining \$49,750 of the \$110,000 is going out to 10 outreach programs/community charities on behalf of First Lutheran Church.

All the grant applications were due on March 1, 2025. I asked everyone

submitting and reviewing to commit this to their prayers and ask the Lord to guide us through the process. We came together on March 20, 2025, and I could not be prouder of the combined work of the church council and the Foundation board. My thanks to the council. And my thanks to Darlene Becker, Rudy Frank, Sue Johnson, Steve Falk, Kathy Richards, Sara Lemke, Barb Tapovatz, Doug Johnson, James Liebetrau, Jerry Wells, Tim Drinkwater and Pastor Michael Mueller.

Finally, we need to celebrate that Jerry Wells has served on the Foundation board for 50 years. And he will continue to serve! He has been so passionate and committed to it. He has been a great leader and blessing to our church.

# CHURCH FINANCIALS

The financials for the new fiscal year through March 2025 are shown below. The weekly need is calculated by averaging the total budgeted expenses for 12 months (from July 2024 through June of 2025). The weekly average YTD is the total income received, divided by the number of weeks in this fiscal year, to date. The graph shows the budgeted expenses in green, the actual


expenses in blue and the monthly income received as a black dot and line. March had a large increase in giving bringing us close to budget for contributions. Expenses have been just a few thousand under budget.
