SPIRIT-LED APPRENTICES OF JESUS

At First Glance is a new podcast series that we have recently begun recording. You can find the episodes posted on our website, flcj.org/podcast. Each week Jarod Wasson and I engage the Gospel reading for the coming Sunday. We read the story and then share what resonates with us or what captures our attention. Going further, we talk about some of the ways that the story connects with our own lives and the world we live in.



Through our conversations together, we hope to invite our listeners into their own engagement with the story. What resonates with *you*? What connections do *you* hear between the story and your life, the life of our community, and the world we live in? What questions does the story raise for *you*? Let this be the start of a weekly encounter with the Gospel. As you keep listening to the story throughout the week, what do you hear the Spirit saying to you? What is the call to action? Using a journal to record your thoughts and questions could be an effective way to listen even more deeply.

In a book that I have recently been reading (Exponential by Dave Ferguson), the author suggests "apprentice" as a synonym for "disciple". An apprentice is positioned to learn new skills from somebody who is already well trained. Under the supervision of a skilled tradesperson, the apprentice studies and learns to apply the needed skills to become a carpenter or electrician. We are called to learn and serve as apprentices of Jesus.

As apprentices, the original disciples learned the values and commitments of the "kingdom of God," the new way of living in community that Jesus taught. They watched Jesus bring healing



to the people he encountered on the way. They witnessed his strong casting out of life-diminishing powers that had kept many people bound. They saw the abundance of life and hope that his message and his compassion brought to people. After they had watched and learned from him for a time, Jesus empowered them to go out and do the same. He sent them to share the same message and to bring healing and new hope to people. Jesus didn't just fill their heads with new ideas and leave it at that. He taught them how to live and enact the purposes of God, so that they could go out and do it themselves. And then, he brought them back together and taught them some more.

The conversion of our lives, so that we come to live like Christ, is generally a slow process of learning and transformation. As you keep listening to these Gospel stories, I encourage you to pray that the Spirit would indeed teach you to live like Christ. Slow

reading and prayerful listening with the help of a journal can help us to pay attention and hear what the Spirit is saying to us, so that we can put it into practice.

One of our hopes is that this process will prepare you well for worship on Sunday. Already attentive to ways that the scripture is speaking to you, you will hear the story again in worship, in the context of our gathering around the Table. There the sermon invites further reflection and offers another perspective on the reading. Your listening throughout the week will make you ready to hear something deeper.

Another hope is that others who read these same stories in Sunday worship, perhaps in other communities or states or even countries, might discover these podcasts and connect with our community online.

The Invitation



very good thing in my life started with an invitation. A friend's invitation to coffee that became a lifelong friendship. An open door to a new opportunity reshaped my path. 
STRING QUARTET Concert and Workshop on July 13


