LIVING AS DISCIPLES, TEACHING OTHERS

The Exponential Conference (exponential.org) in November gave a small group of FLC leaders an experience together that invited us to imagine every member of our community making disciples. That picture connects clearly with our congregation's mission to reach, nourish and empower people with the life-giving news of Jesus.



At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus sends the disciples into the world to make disciples, "teaching them to obey all that I've commanded you." The life that they have learned to live with Jesus is the life that they are to invite others to share. The writer of the Ephesians letter expresses in a prayer the transformation that this life will bring: "I ask that you'll know the love of Christ that is beyond knowledge so that you will be filled entirely with the fullness of God." (3:19)

The Ephesians letter focuses a truth at the heart of the whole New Testament message. It celebrates that the transformative power that raises us to new life in Christ is power that comes from God. This power doesn't arise from our own personal abilities or striving. It comes from God, whose

desire, revealed in Christ, is for us to know love and be filled with God's fullness.

Knowing God's desire to share this grace, we can make ourselves available as much as possible to listen for what God is inviting among us. We can look for opportunities to live into compassion and welcome others into this path alongside us.

We are asking members of the new FLC ministry teams to grow into a team covenant that is directed toward the specific ministry focus of each team. Adapting the structure of that covenant a bit, here is a simple set of commitments that we can make to open ourselves to the love that Jesus reveals,

so that we all can be ready to share love with others and grow with them toward maturity in Christ.

Discipleship Covenant

1. **Daily bible reading.** Develop or deepen a daily practice of listening to the scriptures, using the weekly Sunday readings or a reading plan of your choice.
2. **Daily prayer.** Pray for needs of the church, the world, and creation, and for our growth in living the way of Christ. Pray daily for the mission and work of the FLC community.
3. **Weekly community life.** Share life together in at least one way with the FLC community, building relationship with others through worship, service, learning, or communal meals.
4. **Works of love.** Seek ways to use your energy, skills, and creativity in active ministry.

I encourage you to think of this set of commitments, not as goals to achieve,

but rather as the center to which we keep returning. It is only by God's power that we are joined together as God's household and built into a place where God lives through the Spirit (Eph 2:19-22). Returning to these commitments every time we drift away will bring us back, again and again, to openness and availability. These are commitments to listen for God and to follow the Spirit into a life shaped by the love of Christ.

If you were to take on this covenant of discipleship for the year 2026, what resources, support, or encouragement would you need or want from me and others in our community? I am eager to help us all grow in these ways that we might come to "know the love of Christ that is beyond knowledge."

Taking up this challenge, we can become nourished and empowered to teach others the pathway of discipleship that opens us all to the healing life of God. 🕊️

The Messy Middle: When Disciples Fail



Digging deeper into God's Word, together.

Discipleship is rarely a straight line. The story of Peter—bold, loyal, yet deeply flawed—reminds us that even the closest followers of Jesus stumble. Peter's denial of Christ wasn't a minor misstep; it was a heartbreaking failure, especially for someone who once declared unwavering devotion. Fortunately, that's not where Peter's story ends.

After the resurrection, Jesus doesn't shame Peter—He restores him. Three times, Jesus invites Peter to affirm his

love. This is grace. This is redemption. Failure doesn't disqualify us from discipleship. It prepares us for deeper growth.

Too often, we expect the Christian journey to be clean and consistent. But the reality is messy middles—seasons of doubt, fear, and failure. These moments don't need to define us. What matters most is where

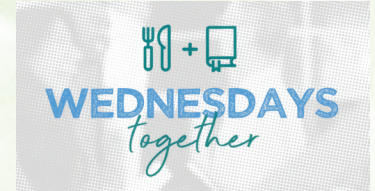
A delicious variety of options will be available, including two kinds of

PRESENTING ON THE MUSICA MAXIMA SERIES

Exciting music is on the program for Sunday, January 25, at 3pm, at First Congregational Church, 801 Bushnell Street in Beloit. Amy Hartsough, FLC Music Director, and Pr. Michael Mueller will be joined by Parker HS Senior, Cooper Buehl. The program includes a variety of solo selections, including folk songs of Benjamin Britten, some sassy and sentimental songs of William Bolcom, and music for organ and piano.

All three performers will come together to present Britten's Canticle II: Abraham and Isaac, which sets to music the story of the testing of Abraham, based on a medieval mystery play. The trio first performed this piece for the Classical Showcase

Concert at FLC in April 2025. In this unsettling biblical story, God calls upon Abraham to offer his only son Isaac as a sacrifice.

The anguished dialogue between Abraham (tenor) and Isaac (mezzo-soprano) draws listeners into the terror and pathos of their plight, building until the moment of release when God stays Abraham's hand and offers him a ram as a substitute. The medieval text invites listeners to recognize the connections to Christ's gift of grace and our call to live with the trust of Abraham.

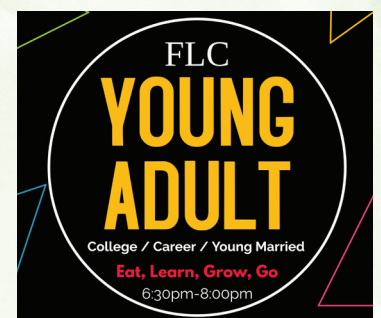

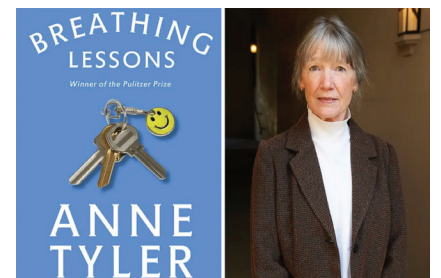

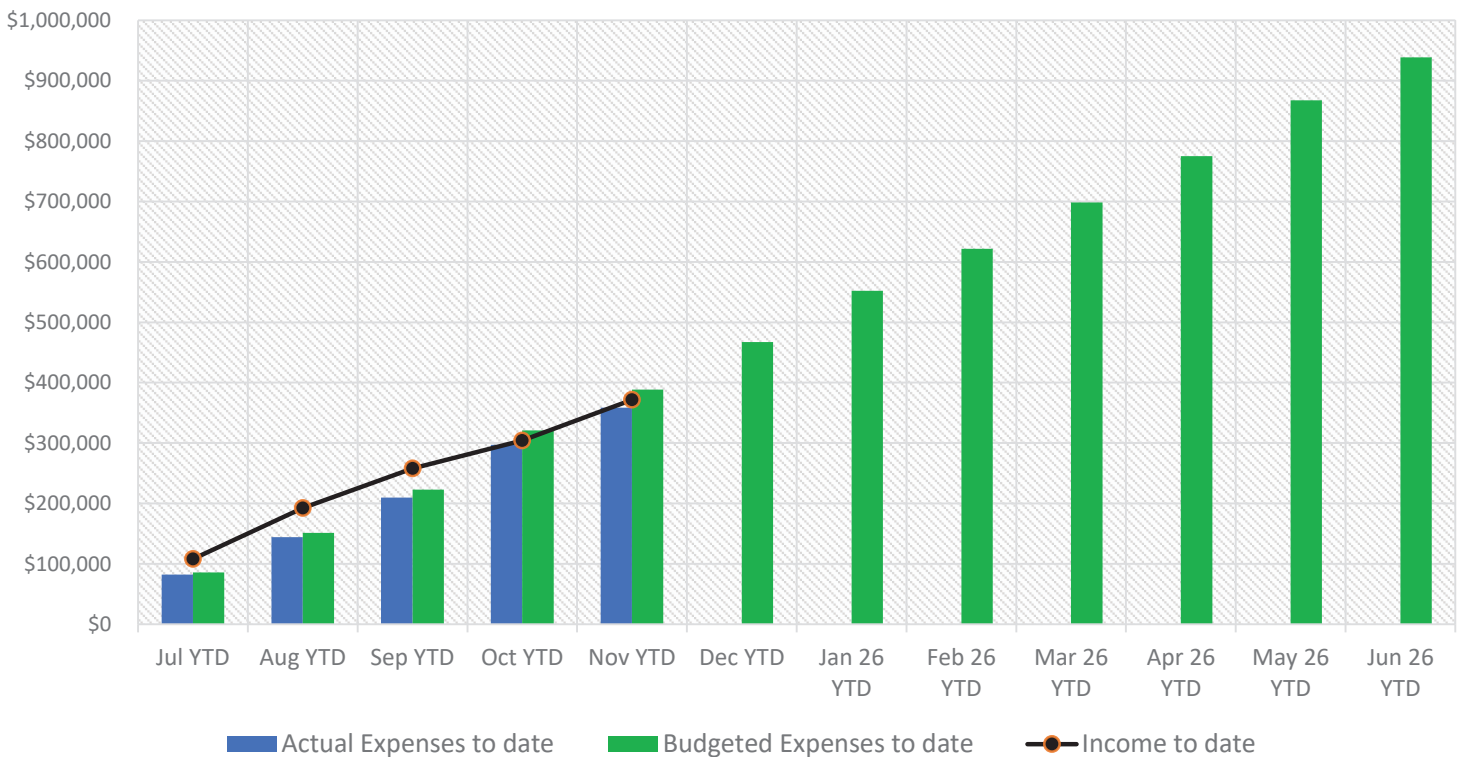
