A FLOOD OF SUPPORT

Reflecting on the first days since the April 19 flood, I feel gratitude.

Our heads are still spinning, as we grapple with the implications of what has happened, but amid the grief and experience of loss, I am grateful for our community's leadership. The Building and Grounds Team and the Council have acted quickly to make decisions and take the actions needed to minimize moisture damage and get building systems running again.

I am grateful for the whole community of our congregation, who have responded in love with a desire to share specialized talents or experience, time, and labor.

Many of you came out to help with the sad and difficult work of clearing out the first level. Everything five feet up from the floor had been damaged or contaminated and much of it had to be pitched. Throwing out 75 completed quilts, works of love created by the women in our Mission Sewers group, was heart wrenching. Many of the things that had to be tossed represented the time, commitment, and love of our community members, material things

that hold the memories made together over decades. It was painful, but we worked together and found support and consolation in one another. I'm grateful.

We were not alone in all of this. People reached out from other congregations and from across our community. More than two hundred people showed up that first weekend. The Child's First Childcare Center lost everything, including their just completed new kitchen next to the Youth Room. Members of their community, staff, and board were part of the work crew. It was empowering to experience the generosity and desire of so many

people to come together as caring neighbors.

Others have offered special skills and network connections. Chad Measner and his family provided meals to volunteers and the congregation. The United Way, the YMCA, various churches in our community, and others have offered their support and connections. Bishop Joy Mortensen-Wiebe, our leader in the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin, came to help lead worship with us on that first Sunday. She has pledged her assistance through connections within the synod and through the wider church. Members have shared engineering, communications, fundraising, and building systems knowledge to guide our way forward. I walked into Mocha Moment to get a cup of coffee, and a member of Cargill UMC recognized me and insisted on buying my coffee. In small ways and large, many people have come together to support and

encourage us during this time. I feel deeply grateful.

Good Shepherd Lutheran Church quickly welcomed us to use their space as much as needed during the time we are restoring the use of our own building. They are sharing generously with us in worship, prayer and community life. We can keep our regular Sunday worship schedule at Good Shepherd: 8am and 9:30am, with Sunday School at 9:15. Most of our regularly scheduled meetings and gatherings will take place at Good Shepherd, until we can get back into First Lutheran. This gift of regular gathering space during the interim provides a much-needed sense of stability. Again, it is good to know that we are not alone.

The Council took action at the April meeting to cancel the Fair Food Booth. We had just reached the deadline for determining whether we could

go forward with the Food Booth. Though we had come very near to the threshold for volunteers needed, a good number of supervisor shifts were still unfilled. More importantly, the time and energy of our leadership and volunteers will now be diverted in new directions for flood recovery. I know that this will be another grief for all who have faithfully served the Food Booth project for years. We will still provide parking for the 4H Fair, so we will focus our volunteer efforts that week on the parking lot. You can find more information in a related article on page 4.

As we look forward, we know that there will be other changes. Now that the lower level has been completely cleared out, we will need to decide how to reconstruct. This offers an opportunity to consider ideas from the building renovation plan we drafted a couple years ago. I invite your prayers for wisdom and the Spirit's guidance, so that we can make choices and decisions that serve God's vision and long-term mission for us in this place.

The Council has called a special congregation meeting on Monday, May 4, 6:30pm, at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. This will give us

the chance to gather in-person for updates and to confirm a not-to-exceed spending limit for the initial recovery plan. I hope that many will be there to participate as we take next steps.

I ask that you also pray for patience in this process and forgiveness when it is needed. We will surely make mistakes along the way, and we won't always agree about the best course of action. This whole experience will challenge us to root ourselves deeper in the gift of life that is the great Easter promise. As we practice the way of love that Jesus modeled for us, we have a chance to become more visibly the body of Christ that shows his love to the world.

FLC's leadership team is committed to being transparent and will provide weekly email updates on Wednesdays. When you go to our congregation's homepage, flcj.org, a pop-up window will also provide current updates. We welcome your questions, so that we can provide timely responses.

I am grateful for your love and faithfulness. I pray for you, as I know you are praying for me. 🕊️

FOUNDATION DISTRIBUTES 2026 GRANTS

Once again, the Lord has blessed First Lutheran Church, and the Foundation continues to be able to increase our annual disbursements to our community's charitable organizations and the outreach and capital programs of our church. Thanks to all of you for your continued donations and trust. I would also like to thank the members of the Foundation Board for their commitment to the thoughtful and faith-based approach to our annual process and working together to grow the Foundation's funds. The Church Council continues to partner with us in this effort and they deserve a great amount of thanks for helping collect grant applications and prioritizing the needs. Working together with the council has truly made this whole process better.

At our January meeting we reviewed our investment results for 2025. As most of you know the stock market and most investments had positive results for the year. Therefore, the Board decided to allocate \$115,000 for grant disbursement for 2026. This is our highest level ever and we were very excited to move on to the grant application process. All grant applications were due on March 1, 2026. We received 27 applications for a

total of \$151,194. It is unfortunate that we could not approve all of them. The needs in our community and church programs continue to be greater than the available dollars. At the Foundation Board meeting on March 19, 2026, we carefully and thoughtfully reviewed all applications and made the decision on the following disbursements:

We continue to closely monitor our investments and prayerfully commit the FLC Foundation's efforts to our congregation's outreach programs and goals. Please feel free to contact me or any of the foundation board members if you have any questions.

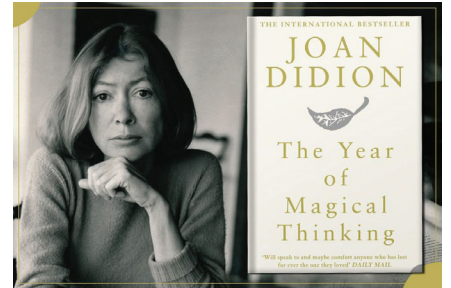

The weekly need is calculated by averaging the total budgeted expenses for 12 months (from July 2025 through June of 2026). The weekly average YTD is the total income received, divided by the number of weeks in this fiscal year, to date. The graph shows the budgeted expenses in green,

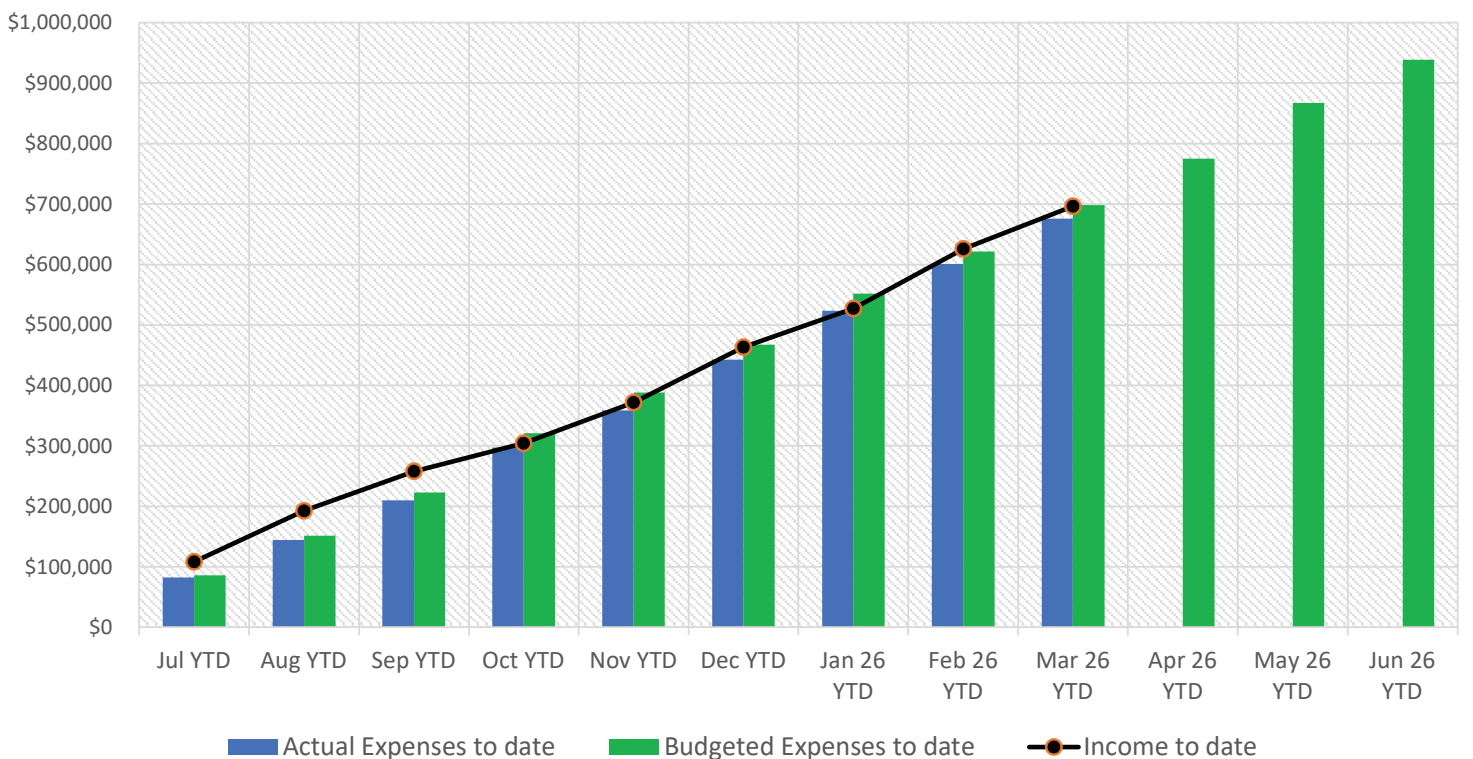
the actual expenses in blue and the monthly income received as a black dot and line. Total income for July through March was below budget again, however, expenses remain slightly lower than anticipated, so year to date net income continues to be higher than monthly expenses. ⓘ
